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INTRODUCTION

Angoff: Good morning...I am Allan Angoff of the Parapsychology Foundation. For the trustees, I am glad to call to order and open this Twenty-Seventh Annual International Conference of the Foundation.

This conference series was begun, as many of you know, almost three decades ago, shortly after the Foundation was organized by Eileen J. Garrett and Frances P. Bolton, two remarkable friends of science and learning. They recognized in those pioneering days of parapsychology the importance of bringing together from all over the world some of the men and women working in isolation in a field regarded by so many of their academic colleagues as too remote for respectable research. Let us recall here again that even the daring Thomas Henry Huxley called it "twaddle" and that Hermann Von Helmholtz said telepathic communication "is clearly impossible." He would not believe it even if it were endorsed by the Fellows of the Royal Society itself.

In the midst of such negativism pervading the academic world—as it still does, albeit to a lesser degree—Eileen Garrett inaugurated these conferences to encourage those early parapsychologists "to advance beyond an easy orthodoxy of thought and technique into the broader aspect of physics, chemistry, and biology, and to relate these fields of research to the human personality and the largely unknown extrasensory capacities it contains."

Our conference sessions today and tomorrow are addressed to the theme: "Brain/Mind and Parapsychology," and the distinguished scientists it has brought together are, I think, eloquent testimony to the vision of Eileen Garrett and to what she so well termed—again, to use her precise words, "the advance beyond easy orthodoxy." A pause now for a moment, ladies and gentlemen, to introduce Eileen Garrett's successor—the second president of the Parapsychology Foundation—Mrs. Eileen Coly.
